

The election returns of last night indicate a clean sweep of the Republican ticket, Colcord's majority, which comes rolling in from all directions indicates that he comes out a winner by 1,500 majority and that the whole ticket will be elected by majorities ranging from 500 to 1,300. Bartine for Congress is running nearly up with Colcord and will administer another heavy defeat to Cassidy.

The people of the State are to be congratulated upon placing a man of such excellent abilities and so clean a record in the gubernatorial chair and also upon the fact that they have endorsed the eminent silver services of Hon. H. F. Bartine. Ormsby, by its majority of 315 for the head of the ticket, once more steps into line as the banner county of the State, a title it long disputed with Washoe.

The Republican county ticket at midnight seemed safe throughout. It has been a splendid fight and well-earned victory for the party of progress, and the indecent assaults upon the reputation of Nevada, made under the cloak of the Democratic platform, have been rebuked by the people.

Ignored the Big Timber.

The Salt Lake Tribune says: On the 25th of October, United States District Attorney J. W. Whitely by the direction of Attorney-General Miller, dismissed the timber suits of the United States against the Eureka Consolidated Mining Company, Limited, of London, which have so long been pending and which involved in the aggregate \$10,000,000. This was the estimate that Uncle Sam's astute agents made of the value of the scrub pine and cedar wood gathered among the rocky hills of central Nevada. They might with the same propriety have sued for the same kind of "timber" gathered in the past thirty years on the mountains within a radius of twenty miles. The agents did not look up in the Sierras where there is timber—where the mighty monarchs of the pine forests have for three decades been laid low. They looked after bundles of faggots when they might have found "pines fit to be the masts of some great admiral; hunted mountain rats and ignored the grizzly kings of the high Sierras.
