United States Indian Training School, Carson City, Nevada, October 15, 1890.

Sealed proposals, endorsed, "Proposals for Beef, Flour, etc." as the case may be, and addressed to the undersigned, will be received, until 2 o'clock, Friday, November 7, 1890, for furnishing and delivering at this school about 50,000 lbs barley, 25,000 lbs Not-beef, 25,000 Flour, 10,000 lbs Oats, 1,000 lbs Salt and 20,000 lbs hay.

Barley must be fair color, sound, clean, and reasonably free from other grain, not weighing less than 43 pounds to the bushel, in new 8-ounce burlap sacks of about 100 pounds capacity. Not Beef shall be good in quality and condition, fit for immediate use, and from fore and hind-quarter meat proportionately, including all the best cuts thereof. Beef from bulls, stags or diseased cattle shall not be delivered. The necks of the cattle slaughtered for beef shall be cut off at the fourth vertebral joint, and the breast trimmed down; the shanks of fore-quarters shall be cut off four inches above the knee joint and the hind-quarters eight inches above the hock joint. Necks, shanks and kidney-tallow will not be received. Delivery must be made at such times and in such quantities as may be required.

Flour must be what is known as "straight, full stock," of good sound wheat, grown in the section of the country contiguous to the place of delivery—60 pounds of wheat to be ground down to 42 pounds of flour—and delivered in extra strong single cotton sacks, to weigh 3 ounces to the yard; said sacks to be of about 100 pounds capacity. Samples of not less than 25 pounds must be furnished by bidders; said samples to be marked with the name of the bidder, in small letters, and the number of the sample if more than one is submitted. Delivery to be made in such quantities as may be required.

Oats must be bright and clean, well sacked, and weigh not less than 32 pounds to the bushel. Salt must be of good quality, packed in double sacks, burlap covered with gunny.

Each bid must state specifically the proposed price of each article offered. The right is reserved to reject any or all bids, or any part of any bid, if deemed for the best interests of the Government.

Each bid must be accompanied by a certified check or draft upon some United States Depository, payable to the order of the undersigned; which check or draft shall be not less than five per centum on the amount of the bid, and shall be forfeited to the United States in case any bidder receiving an award shall fail to execute promptly a contract, with good and sufficient sureties, according to the terms of his bid; otherwise, to be returned to the bidder.
