The cylinder head of the steamer Telephone blew out while the vessel was nearing Portland Thursday. A Chinaman was seriously injured.

A ranch hand was robbed by three men in the suburbs of Sacramento Thursday afternoon. The robbers were captured and \$60 of the \$70 stolen money recovered.

A natural gas and hot water well has been discovered 500 yards from the Donahue Railroad, and two miles North of Sonoma. The flow of gas is remarkable and measures 9,000 feet every twenty-four hours. The well has now been bored to the depth of thirty-six feet.

Haupt, the Butte real estate man who jumped a piece of land near Helena, Mont., built a small house on the property. The owners moved on the trespasser Wednesday ordered him out of the house and off the ground at the end of shot-guns, and set fire to the shanty. He was threatened with death if he returns.


