

**LEGISLATIVE PROGNOSTICATIONS.**

The Reno Gazette makes the following forecast:

About the first thing to engage the attention of the members of the coming Legislature when they reach Carson will be the scramble for positions by those anxious to become officers and attaches. None have any doubts of the session lasting the full sixty days, and all are anxious to feed at the public crib during that time. After the organization is perfected, the first absorbing duty will be to introduce, read once, consider read the third time, and order engrossed, an act appropriating the usual sum of \$55,000 to meet the expense of the fifteenth session of the Legislature. Then an act authorizing the appointment of a clerk for the Judiciary Committee of the Senate will probably follow. By this time a joint resolution will be meandering through both Houses, appointing a day and place when the Legislature will canvass the returns and declare the result of the vote on the call for a constitutional convention. When this is done, a bill, or perhaps one in each House, will be introduced providing for the time and place of holding the convention, fixing its duration, and providing for the election of its delegates, and naming the per diem of members, of floors and attaches. It must go farther and provide for the election by the people, to adopt or reject it. How speedily this bill may become a law depends upon the earnestness of the present Legislature. Many will be in doubt and willing to listen to argument; many will be ready to air their oratory, and some may be willing to block progress and develop some cause for inaction. This will consume time, and in the meantime the various committees must get to work to provide something for the clerks to do. Then the Committee of Ways and Means will be in a quandary as to how to provide for the present or the changed condition. By this time bills will be introduced without number, the State Printing Office will be crowded beyond its capacity, the members will begin to like the gay life of the State Capital, the church fairs and the O. N. O. club will engage their evenings if faro and poker doesn't, and all alike, will be loath to lay aside their Legislative titles until the limit of time is reached.

The surrender of 150 of Sitting Bull's band means the virtual end of the Indian war as far as the worst braves among the Sioux are concerned. It is probable that the other hostiles will now come in if they are given assurance of immunity. General Miles has proved in this brief and well nigh bloodless campaign that he knows the Indian thoroughly and understands how to deal with him. A vacillating course, such as has been pursued so often in previous Indian wars, would have resulted in serious loss of the life and great damage to property of ranchmen in Dakota. Force is the only thing which the Indians respect, and the capture and death of Sitting Bull convinced the hostiles that Miles meant business.

**Everything Unconstitutional.**  
Judge Wells, in the Carson Tribune, asserts that the vote upon the Constitutional Convention was not constitutional; that the county clerks had no constitutional right to receive or certify to the votes; and that there is no constitutional power in the State to canvass therein. There are lots of other things connected with the matter which he says are unconstitutional, and if he is correct, it appears to be somewhat a matter of doubt whether our present constitution itself is constitutional.—Chronicle.
