COAST NEWS.

William Harris of Goshen, Tulare county, lost an arm while hunting Thursday.

Mrs. Amy Patten, aged one hundred and three years, died near San Bernardino Wednesday.

David F. Lee, a young man at Victoria B. C., was shot down in the streets of Victoria, B. C., Thursday by an unknown person.

Pedro Antonio Lopez died near Santa Fe, N. M., Tuesday, at the age of one hundred and fifteen years, surrounded by several generations of descendants.

John M. Shoop, who killed Grant Lebar, a miner, near Prescott, A. T., and was confined in jail, cut his throat with a razor Thursday and died in a few moments afterward.

At Fairfield Thursday, while two boys, George Enrick and Alva Alexander, were hunting, the latter's gun was accidentally discharged, the charge entering Enrick's head just above the forehead, cutting a channel through to the back, and exposing the brain.

The colored people at Tacoma, Wash., have organized a protective association, the object of which is to encourage immigration and to improve the condition of the colored people. A section of the Constitution prohibits any effort to create influence of a political nature.

Squaw Murdered.

Last Sunday afternoon the dead body of "Little Maggie," a well-known Piute woman, was found in a fence corner at the head of the street running north of the M. E. Church and within a stone's throw of that building. Investigation showed that her throat had been cut from ear to ear and that the deed had probably been committed early Saturday night. The bloody marks of the brutal murderer's hands were found on the top board and a post of the fence over which he had climbed into the Broker field. He was tracked to a near stream where he had evidently stopped to wash his hands. A Coroner's jury investigated the affair and returned a verdict to the effect that the woman had been murdered by an unknown party, and that there was reasonable ground to suspicion one Manuel Leon—a Mexican—of the crime. He was placed under arrest and the matter will be the subject of further investigation. It is one of the results of selling whisky to a class who are known to buy it for Indians.—*Inyo Index.*
