COAST NEWS.

H. H. Spencer of Los Angeles committed suicide at San Bernardino by taking morphine. Failure of his mining interests is the supposed cause.

Every business man in Seattle is to be required to take out a license, the cost of which will range from \$40 to \$400. The financial needs of the city make the tax a necessity.

Five hundred people attended an indignation meeting at Riverside, called to protest against the action of W. A. Hayt, who is building Chinese quarters on the best street in the city.

Since the publication of the statement that Senator Stanford would give a California dinner to President Harrison, numerous telegrams have been received in Washington from all over California, offering everything, from flowers, fruits and wines to asparagus, peas and new potatoes.

Danger to the Asylum.

The Gazette understands that there is a movement on foot to put the Asylum into the hands of a non professional man and employ a physician who will be subject to his dictation. Such a thing was never heard of in any country on earth, and is the height of folly for any one to give it serious consideration, but as the average Washoe politician does not care a whit for the poor unfortunates who are obliged to be locked up in the State madhouse, for such it has been for the past decade, they will stand watching, pumping the Asylum should be in the hands of a competent man—one who is not only a competent physician, but a competent business man as well. We have no fear that the Legislature will change the law to make a place for anyone, and that is all there is in the rumor. Nevada can ill afford to make a charity hospital for decayed politicians out of any of her institutions while she has a hard struggle to keep afloat. It is well enough, hence, to keep an eye on the gun or the politician may spike it. To make this proposed change will necessitate the building of another family residence at the Asylum, and the addition of a fifth wheel to the coach with a big salary.—Reno Gazette.

Of Interest to the Clergy.

Chief Justice Bleckley, in deciding that the Antioch Baptist Church must be sold to pay the salary of the preacher, says: "If any debt ought to be paid it is the one contracted for the health of souls, for pious ministrations and holy services. If any class of debtors ought to pay, as a matter of moral as well as legal duty, the good people of the Christian church are that class. No church can have any higher obligation resting upon it than that of going just. The law grants exemptions of property to families, but it don't to corporations or cooperative bodies, lay or ecclesiastical. These must pay their legal debts if they can; all their property, legal and equitable, is subject. We think Court may well constrain this church to justice. It is certainly an energetic measure to sell a church to pay a preacher, nor would it be allowable to do so if other means were available to satisfy the debt."
