COAST NEWS.

Mrs. Cloette M. P. Hilliard a lady who has earned considerable fame as an authoress, died on Tuesday night at Los Angeles of a congestive chill. Mrs. Hilliard was a grandniece of Charles Howard Payne.

The body of the woman who was shot at Bakersfield by her lover has been identified as that of Mrs. J. N. Petty of San Diego, who deserted her husband several months ago. The report was first published that the dead woman was Mrs. Clendenning, whose husband shot Judge Pierce at San Diego some months ago.
