

A SECRET BALLOT.

The Assembly has passed La-Grave's Senate Bill No. 1, providing for a secret ballot based on the Australian system, by a vote of 34 to 6. All friends of an honest and untrammelled expression of the will of the people at the ballot box will be rejoiced at this, for whatever may be said against the present Legislature this action in behalf of honest elections covers a multitude of sins. Notwithstanding the statement of the Reno Gazette that the Democrats were opposed to such a measure, as "its adoption would break them up in business," we have the proud satisfaction of knowing that the bill was introduced by a Democrat, that it is indorsed by the Democrats of the State, and we say all honor to a Republican Legislature which has passed it. There is no question that the Governor will sign it. Our next general election will be held in accordance with its provisions, and the industry of vote purchasing in Nevada will be a thing of the past.--Independent.

The contest for Senator in California to elect a man to succeed the late Senator Hearst is not of absorbing interest in this region, simply because, so far, while all the gentlemen named are worthy gentlemen, there are none of them men of such commanding force and influence as to attract any especial attention from the outside. The Senate Committee in charge of proposed Amendments to the Constitution, has left out or thrown out, every proposition leading to an Educational qualification for voters. What the object was is not clear, but it is pretty clear that the Assembly knows what it is doing in this respect and that it will insert the necessary words in relation to reading and writing English. The people of Nevada have become aroused to the importance of an intelligent vote, and believe there is both profit and pride in having its elections determined by men who can read the laws.

A chicken contest took place here yesterday between a half blood Japanese owned by General Booton, and a quarter Jap owned by George Hall. The General's bird was heeled and handled by George Mershon, the other by its owner. After fifteen minutes' fighting the General's bird had a wing broken and Hall's lost a gaff. Notwithstanding these disadvantages, the birds, which are pure game, fought for an hour and a half, the Reno bird finally wearing its opponent out, and was declared the victor. Mr. Hall would like to hear from anyone who thinks he has a better breed of chicken than his.--Journal.

Charles Stewart Parnell has issued a manifesto to Irish-Americans in which he reviews the struggle for home rule since 1880 and appeals to his fellow countrymen to once more assist him in quelling the mutiny and disloyalty to Ireland, and help him in securing an independent parliamentary party, to make one more effort to win freedom and prosperity for Ireland by Constitutional means.

In the Assembly last evening a motion to indefinitely postpone a resolution requesting Nevada's Representatives in Congress to call the attention of the Interstate Committee to discrimination in Nevada was lost. Some friends of the Resolution were absent, or it would have passed.
