The Coinage of Silver will Continue.

WASHINGTON, June 18.—Secretary Foster, in his speech written for delivery at the Ohio Republican Convention, paid particular attention to the silver question, and made a special point in regard to coinage, calling attention to the fact that after July 1st it will be discretionary with the Secretary of the Treasury whether silver coinage continues or not. A great many suggestions have been offered the Secretary on this indicating that the sentiment is against the suspending of silver coinage, and it is within the range of probability that coinage will continue after July 1st for a while at least.
