## THE MINING SUIT.

John Mackey Shows that He Has Had Experience.

Special to "Appeal."

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 3.—The testimony given by Williams regarding the carrying of bullion to James's office in Gold Hill by private conveyance was to the effect that he had never carried any at night; only in the day time. He did not know that James had ever sold \$150,000 worth of bullion to Joe Douglass.

Senator Jones was unable to be present as a witness, and his deposition was taken in Santa Monica, where he was detained at the bed side of his wife. He owned a half interest in the Mexican Mill and had an interest in the Vivian Mill.

Depositions of Cashier Hofer, C. H. Peters and H. K. Brown of the Bullion, & Exchange Bank, Carson, Nev., was introduced. They declined to answer any questions regarding bullion deposits by the Bank.

Deposition of Wells, Fargo & Co's agent at Empire showed the amounts of bullion shipments by the Mexican and Vivian Mills from January 1st, 1887, to July 1st, 1890.

Woods, for the defendant moved to strike out the testimony, but the motion was denied.

The deposition of Joseph Douglas showed that he had purchased about \$175,000 worth of bullion of assay office.

John Mackay was on the stand this afternoon. He said that if he only got a battery sample of \$42.40 when the car sample assayed \$72.90, he would ascertain the cause of the discrepancy. There should be a general average of \$8 or \$10 between car and battery samples. The Hale & Norcross ore was rebellious; he had seen bunches of ore which caused a loss of three or four pounds of quicksilver; he had noticed such in Con. Virginia at time ore could be milled for five or six dollars a ton.

Mr. Mackay's examination drew a large crowd. He was under examination all the afternoon and gave a clear and extended description of the various processes of milling. He was regarded as having the most thorough knowledge of milling and mining of any witness yet on the stand.

## Has Seen the Gold.

Eugene Gallagher, of East Walker river, says the reports recently published to the effect that gold has never been discovered on the island of Terra del Fuego, are false. Mr. Gallagher, who claims to have been Commander of the ship Dreadnaught at the time, says he was wrecked on the island on the 4th day of July in 1869, and saw gold nuggets as ornaments upon the natives. By signs they made him he understood that they had secured it right there, and the size of the pieces indicated that they must have come from a heavy lode of gold bearing quartz. The marine records of the San Francisco custom house prove what he says. He is now in this city.

## Timber Lands.

Commissioner Carter of the General Land office has issued a form of permit to be granted persons applying to cut timber from public lands. Among the stipulations is one for bidding the cutting of more than 50 per cent. of timber of that class growing on an acre. A monthly statement under oath is required, giving descriptions of the tracts from which the timber is taken. No trees shall be cut or removed of less than a specified number of inches in diameter, except for a needed roadway through the timber. The persons cutting the timber is required to cut, remove, burn, or otherwise dispose of the tops and brush of the trees, etc., to prevent forest fires, and will be held liable in damages for the spread of fires attributable to his neglect.
