THE MINING SUIT.

The Grand Jury Asked to Indict Levy and Keating.

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 4.—No testimony was taken in the Hale & Norcross today, and the Court adjourned till Monday.

Today Dr. Griswold, President of the Exchange, sent a communication to the Grand Jury setting forth the testimony in the Hale & Norcross case; he showed that large amounts of bullion had been appropriated by direction of Hale & Norcross officials. After numerous specifications against various parties, calls for the indictment of Levy and Keating.

It is thought here that the Grand Jury will decline to take any action in the matter until the defense have a chance to be heard.

Tom Murphy Skips.

From all the facts that can be gathered in the matter it would appear that Tom Murphy, the man who beat Cara some time ago, has lavanted from the Comstock to avoid arrest on the charge of mayhem. On the 1st of the month a warrant for his arrest on this charge was issued, it having been settled that Cara has lost the use of the eye which suffered so much in the fracas between the men. On the 21 the warrant was placed in officer Bartlett's hands, who learned that Murphy had left town. On the evening of the 2d (Wednesday night) Bartlett went to Carson in quest of Murphy, having received a telegram during the day from Sheriff Botsford of Ormsby county informing him that Murphy had arrived in that city at 2 o'clock the previous morning. When Bartlett arrived in Carson, however, he was unable to find his man, and returned yesterday without him.

Whether Murphy is hiding in Carson or has got away to California is not known but the latter is likely to be the case. He evidently was informed or surmised that a serious charge was about to be preferred against him, and taking time by the forelock, made good his escape.—Enterprise.

Tried to Kill Russell Sage.

A man giving the name of D. H. Wilson entered the office of Russell Sage in New York yesterday and demanded a million dollars. Upon being refused he dropped a carpet bag upon the floor and an explosion followed. Several of the clerks were killed and Sage had his hair and clothes torn off. The glass in the building was shattered and the shock knocked men senseless in the street below. A clerk was blown through a window and badly lacerated.

Sage regards it as a deliberate attempt to kill him and destroy the building. The dynamiter was killed Sage is not seriously injured.

COAST NEWS.

It is now claimed that the loss of life near Canton Station Or., by a recent landslide on the Northern Pacific will reach 25.

Brakeman Coughlan, on a Southern Pacific freight, was killed near tunnel 9 on the Oregon road, Saturday night. A portion of train was derailed.

The yearling Fausta, paced a mile in 2:22 at Stockton Saturday. Athadon, a yearling colt trotted a mile in 2:25. Bell Bird, a yearling, trotted a mile in 2:25.

Sam Leffler, a watchman in the Southern Pacific yards, at Los Angeles, was killed by a tramp Sunday night. Two men are under arrest. One is severely wounded, and claims that Leffler shot him and that he then killed Leffler.

Dr. Guibuson of Santa Paula, says the Los Angeles Times is authority for the statement that the San Francisco Examiner's grizzly bear was purchased by Allen Kelly of a man near Acton, on Gleason Mountain, for \$300, and the Examiner then told the public in a thrilling story of how the monster was captured.

The Apaches are reported to be on the warpath in Arizona again. R. H. Daniels was killed by them Thursday night at a place about thirty five miles from Wilcox, and Major Downing was ambushed and shot at the same point. Great excitement exists among the settlers, who fear a raid from the Indians in the Chiricuhua Mountains.

Colonel Douglas Gunn, ex-mayor of San Diego, and formerly proprietor of the Daily Union, and one of the most prominent men in Southern California, and at one time a resident of San Francisco, was found dead in his private office Saturday. The family who has not seen him since Wednesday, thought he had gone to Cajon, on business and were horrified to learn that he had been dead a day or so and that he died alone. Physicians say death was instantaneous and was caused by paralysis of the heart.
