The New York Commercial Bulletin figures up the losses by fire in the United States during January of the present year at \$12,464,900.

Kentucky does not like the working of a State Board of Equalization, and a bill has been introduced in the Senate of that State to abolish said Board.

The National Educational Society proposes the celebration of the anniversary of the discovery of America in the public schools of the whole country on Oct. 12th next.

Among the latest patents issued in Washington is one for an electro-propelling ticycle, which it is claimed, will run at the rate of from eight to twelve miles an hour at a nominal cost.

An effort is being made to force the Chinese out of Walla Walla by a general boycott and by threatening those who persist in patronizing the Mongolians.

Mrs. Shay, the matron of the Woman's Relief Corps Home at Evergreen, Santa Clara Co., Cal., will be asked to resign, as a result of the investigation into the management of the Home.

Theodore Leckband, who had a ranch at Westport, Or., and made cedar floats for salmon nets, has been missing since August last, and his relatives in Adair, Iowa, are making inquiries for him. There are fears of foul play.

Dr. J. A. Sapp, a well known physician and respected citizen of San Jacinto, Wednesday shot and killed R. L. Pool, a prominent druggist, in a street fight. It is not known how the dispute which caused the shooting arose.

R. H. Tyler, General Agent for the National Benevolent Association of Minneapolis, who committed suicide at San Diego Wednesday, assigned as his reason for the act that he could not make life a success, and that whiskey was at the bottom of it all.

The people of Sanger, Fresno Co., are wrought up over the action of three young men who drugged and abducted a young lady, finally leaving her in a disreputable house. Thomas Backman, Frank Burns and Brock Limbaugh, are now under arrest and the feeling is very strong against them.

The man who cut out his tongue at Los Angeles last November, it is now ascertained, is named George Wilson. He is from a wealthy New York family, is a gambler and the black sheep of the family. His father has just died and George's share of the estate is \$6,000. His present whereabouts are unknown.

Friday of last week the suspected train wrecker, Al. Roberts, who was acquitted by a jury, made his appearance in Colfax for the first time since the day he was arrested. That evening a delegation of two citizens, representing a strong organization of the people of Colfax, waited on him and served him with a written notice to leave that part of the country within thirty minutes and never to return.
