

NEW YORK METHODS.

The news that Senator Quay found when he undertook the management of the campaign in 1886, that Mr. Blaine had in 1884 been cheated out of the electoral vote of the State of New York, does not surprise any one because that has been the fixed impression in millions of minds ever since the final returns were brought in. The Democrats changed the count in one district of New York City three or four times between election day and the day when the official returns were filed, and the conclusion then was and ever since has been that those in charge knew exactly how the precinct honestly stood, and that they held the district until the final returns from the State at large had been received, and then added Democratic votes enough to give Mr. Cleveland about a thousand majority in the State.

Probably that is politics. Probably the party justifies the business on the ground that the other side ought to have looked out and prevented that kind of a steal; but the party that does endorse it should never have anything to say about the election of 1876 when their candidate, after trying to steal three or four States and to buy one, was finally beaten; and when a plan for counting the votes was proposed by the Democrats and accepted by the Republicans, and the Commission decided that the Republican candidate was elected. In point of fact, there has never been an honest election in New York City since 1844. It ought to be separated from the State at large, and so far as electoral votes and votes for Senators and Representatives in Congress are concerned, it should figure exactly as a sovereign State. Then the devilry committee there would not neutralize the honest vote of the State at large.—Salt Lake Tribune.
