

A SIGNIFICANT STRAW.

One of the most significant straws in the political situation in Nevada is the gradual change of front on the part of the Enterprise from a silver organ to an abject mouthpiece of the gold bugs of New York.

For some years it floated the silver banner high at the masthead, but now it has thrown overboard every principle of State pride and journalistic consistency, and boldly advertises its servitude to the monied ring. It says:

For the pretended Republican papers such as the Silver State and Carson Appeal—that are in the service of Wallace and Cassidy, and would as readily betray silver as they would the party to which they claim membership, while never neglecting an opportunity to urge something to urge something to its injury—there is no excuse. Flattering a popular sentiment that they do not share, they are probably interested in keeping attention away from the Southern Pacific road, and a pretended ardor for silver and hatred for everything Republican is a convenient disguise. Never venturing an opinion of their own until they thing they have discovered the current of public feeling, their misrepresentations, false pretenses and too noisy self-assertions may be accepted as certain indications of a very weak regard for the cause.

The above is by no means the utterance of the old Territorial Enterprise, but the talk of the mouthpiece of Mr. Mills, a resident of New York who owns the V. & T. R. R. of this city and who, according to the sworn annual statement of the company clears a thousand dollars a day out of the people of Nevada, which is spent in New York.

For years the V. & T. company has been the sole master of politics in Nevada; it has controlled the legislature, the State Conventions and the Republican party. No man can be nominated on a State ticket without the permission of this corporation and if nominated cannot be elected if the road decides he shall not be.

Here is the situation: D. O. Mills, a non-resident of the State and a man who openly proclaims his allegiance to the gold ring of New York and is one of them, has for years been, through his agents, the absolute dictator of Nevada and now through two of his organs, the Enterprise and Reno Gazette, is attempting to teach the people of this State how to vote on the question of silver coinage.

We do not think the people of Nevada desire any longer to go to school to Mr. Mills. The spontaneous silver movement now sweeping like a prairie fire over Nevada, has alarmed the foreign bosses of the Republican party in Nevada and they are leaving no stone unturned to see it checked. The success of the silver movement in this State means the death knell of their long domination in Nevada.

They are making a frantic fight to squelch the movement but it has passed beyond their control and if the people of the State, the regular residents, citizens and voting masses will stand by their guns they can wipe out boss rule in Nevada forever and run and own the State they helped to build up.

There are enough papers left in this State that do not wear the collar of the bosses and the people can depend upon having them for standard bearers in this fight. This movement has reached such proportions that at the present time the silver men in Nevada have on their rolls a majority of all the voters of this State.

The Republican State Convention will meet in Virginia City tomorrow. The delegates cannot say that they represent party or people. In this county, one of the most populous in the State, the eighteen delegates will represent twenty-three voters. The Humboldt delegation will represent only a few voters in Winnemucca, and the Eureka delegates were appointed by the Central Committee. The plain unvarnished truth is that Nevadans are in dead earnest this year and cannot be deceived by Wall street pellets labeled "Republicanism or Democracy."—Journal.

The delegates from this county represent 66 voters, less than ten per cent of the total vote.
