THE MONEY PLANK.

The following is the money plank adopted in the Republican party at Minneapolis:

That the American people, from tradition and interest, favor bimetalism, and the Republican party demands the use of both gold and silver as standard money, with such restrictions and under such provisions, to be determined by legislation, as will secure the maintenance of the parity of values of the two metals, so that the purchasing and debt-paying power of the dollar, whether of silver, gold or paper, shall be at all times equal.

The above plank is not even a straddle but a square attempt to humbug the adherents of bimetalism. Were a free coinage bill to pass Harrison if he wished could veto the bill by quoting the very language of the plank, by claiming that a bill in favor of the silver dollar was against the policy of his party.

If this is a regular silver plank as claimed, why did Whitelaw Reid the editor of the leading gold organ of the United States accept a place on the ticket. Harrison repudiated the silver plank of four years ago and what assurance have we that he will regard his pledges any more now than he did then.

The "Appeal" Was Right.

During the convention the following dispatch was sent from New York:

Several New York papers have, through their correspondents at Minneapolis, canvassed the probable vote on the first ballot, at the convention with the following result:

Herald: Blaine 451, Harrison 453. World: Blaine 472, Harrison 430. Sun: Blaine 524, Harrison 376.

At the mean time the APPEAL correspondent stated that the estimates were all wrong, and that no one could do any more than to guess at the result.

The first ballot demonstrates the correctness of his views. Thus the APPEAL was nearer right than the Sun, Herald, and World, of New York, and yet there will be no advance in the price of subscription. Twenty five cents a week or eight dollars a year captures the whole thing.

The work of the District Attorney in the trial of the Raymond case was throughout marked by humiliating failure. Whenever he has a genuine lawyer to compete with, his wild work is a matter of general comment.

If he meant business he would have followed the law and prosecuted the owners of the houses. He dare not do this, for fear of losing votes in the next primaries.

His uniform policy of bowing to the rich and jumping on the poor, makes anything he attempts to do in the line of official duty as of no value. His present activity in endeavoring to enforce the 400 yard law, is merely regarded as a cheap bid for the church vote.

It is clear, however, that the defendants are guilty, and with a competent District Attorney the law could be enforced.

When the Enterprise says that Harrison's strength in Nevada is as great as it was at Minneapolis it must purposely attempt to mislead or is ignorant of the real feeling here. There is no use disguising facts and the fact is the nomination was received coldly everywhere.
