

NOMINATED BY THE SOUTH.

Before the Convention Harrison stated positively that he would decline a nomination for the Presidency if it came from the Southern States.

One hundred and forty-six delegates were office-holders, or about one-sixth of the whole number. The Southern States, nearly all of them hopelessly Democratic, sent solid Harrison delegations.

These were worked up by the office holders. The people had practically nothing to do with it.

The bread and butter brigade could not be turned from their purpose, and paid no heed to the protests of the delegates from States where Harrison must look for his strength in the November election.

Politicians who are carefully considering the proposition, admit that it is not a cheering outlook for the campaign.

Harrison allowed his friends to work every lever of public patronage at their command.

Such a campaign detracts from the dignity of so high an office, and shows what the itch for power will do with men heretofore considered great.
