Ordinance No. 89.

An Ordinance regulating Insurance Licenses.

The Board of Trustees of Carson City do ordain:

Section 1.—Every Insurance agent transacting business within Carson City shall first obtain and pay for a license equaling one dollar and fifty cents per quarter for each and every company by him represented.

Section 2.—All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 3.—Every person transacting business for any Insurance Company without paying a license herein provided shall be fined not exceeding Fifty dollars or imprisoned in the city jail not to exceed Twenty-five days or by both such fine and imprisonment.


