WILL HE ACT?

If Ormsby County had a District Attorney who understood the duties of his office and was not controlled by the same ring as the balance of the gang, he would have prevented the drain from the County Treasury of every dollar illegally paid to Commissioner Bray.

Section 1960 of the compiled laws reads as follows:

The District Prosecuting Attorney when not engaged in the District Court and the discharge of his official duties, shall attend the sittings of the County Commissioners when engaged in auditing accounts and claims against the county and in all cases shall oppose such accounts or claims as he may deem unjust, illegal or extortionate.

Section 2003 makes it obligatory upon the District Attorney to institute proceedings to recover money illegally or improperly paid out of the County Treasury.

Section 2118 provides that the District Attorney may be indicted for neglect of duty with a fine not exceeding \$1000 and removal from office.

These sections are quoted, that the taxpayers may see what the District Attorney's duty is under the law.

The APPEAL has no idea that the District Attorney will move in the matter. He owes his office not to the votes of the people, but the votes of the Commissioners, hence his slavish devotion to their wishes.

What we need more than anything is a Grand Jury not drawn by any of the parties interested.

The following remarks were made at Des Moines by General Weaver, the nominee of the People's party for President:

I regard the situation throughout the country as very grave and I have believed for some time that we are nearing a serious crisis. If the present strained relations between the corporations and their employes, between wealth owners and wealth producers continue much longer they will ripen into frightful disaster.

When Rome was near her fall the wealthy barons had their bravos; our corporate barons have their Pinkertons. They are an armed body of cruel mercenaries and a menace to the peace of society and the lives of the people. At their bidding bloodshed follows close upon the heels of corporate tyranny.

They must be suppressed and the terrible economic conditions which have spawned this cruel army of thugs upon the country must be changed at once or the Republic must give way to corporate despotism.

The frightful condition of affairs in Pennsylvania would strike the whole country like an alarm-bell at midnight. Public sympathy will naturally be with those struggling to insist upon the earth and for their wives and little ones.

During the last few years the ring of Ormsby were in the habit of sending some one to a man who talked too freely of politics, with instructions that he, "must keep his mouth shut." This racket is getting a little played out here now. It would require a large force of men to take care of all the mouths that are talking at the present time.

Three or four gold-bug papers in the western part of the State are frothing pro and con as to the man to represent Nevada in the next House. If they don't look out a dark horse will win the race as their support is enough to kill any candidate before the people.—Silver State.
