FAULTY LIENIENCY.

The Examiner ably discusses the act of the Governor of Tennessee in showing such mercy to Col. King the cold blooded murderer of his friend:

The saving of Colonel H. Clay King of Memphis from the gallows through the commutation of his sentence to imprisonment for life by the Governor of Tennessee will probably not excite elsewhere that fierce condemnation which is expressed in the locality where the particulars of his crime are vivid in the public mind. The general feeling will be made of modified satisfaction. the picture of a man of talent, attainments and high rank as a lawyer, who, after a gallant career as a soldier had achieved a front place at the bar, pacing a condemned cell, crushed, disgraced, ruined and half crazed, was a terrible one, and naturally awakened pity. It was felt that this man of brains and education, against whom at his trial his own digest of the laws of Tennessee was quoted with effect by the prosecution, must in the degradation and horror of his situation have suffered agonies unknown to the ordinary criminal, and that he had already died a thousand deaths. That this felling is strong in Tennessee as well as elsewhere, is proved by the Governor's yielding to the pressure that was brought to bear upon him. Nevertheless, the people of Memphis who are so vehemently protesting against this act of clemency are right, and the contrary popular feeling elsewhere, however natural, is wrong.

Precisely to the extent that Colonel King, by reason of his superior intelligence and honorable past, is capable of suffering more than the ordinary criminal is his moral guilt greater than that of the ignorant and debased man who commits murder. Every consideration founded upon King's intellect and position as a gentleman, which now evokes pity for him, should have been an insurance against the commission of the crime for which he has escaped the righteous penalty. Despite the fact that he had been a brave soldier and was ranked by himself and others as a man of honor, his deed of blood was to the last degree cowardly. He shot down without warning an unresisting man whose hand was stretched out to him in proffered amity. It does not lessen the cowardice of the assassin that the man whom he slew had as a lawyer in court made an indefensible reference to Mrs. King. If that insult was one which according to old-fashioned Southern notions called for deadly weapons, the shot should have followed instantly upon the affront or been withheld until fired under the code. Colonel King, the eminent lawyer, the soldier and gentleman, committed as foul a murder as ever was done by the coarsest ruffian. And it is rightly held by the friends of justice in Tennessee that the Governor's clemency is an inexcusable and dangerous discrimination which cannot but deepen the too prevalent conviction that wealth and position have privileges under the law that are denied poverty and ignorance. Tennessee's reputation as a law-respecting State has been injured by the too merciful act of its Governor.
