A SIMPLE MATTER.

Danger Ahead.

The Harrison goldbug speakers should be called upon at every meeting to explain the probable effect upon silver, should the pending Harrison-Sherman bill to repeal the purchasing clause of the present law be passed the coming winter.

It is Senator Wolcott's opinion that in that event silver would drop to 50 cents an ounce. Some high financial authorities put the drop at 40 cents.

It is the imminent danger that now confronts the mining industry, and if it is averted its defeat will be due to the independent free coinage movement of this year and its influence upon the present congress.

This vital point is carefully withheld from the readers of the treacherous goldbug press. Make the Harrison advocates talk about it. Senator Sherman is President Harrison's financial adviser and the inference is clear that the bill reflects Mr. Harrison's views. The Harrison and Cleveland papers east of the Mississippi unite in demanding its prompt enactment when congress assembles. Should it pass there is not five silver mines in Colorado that could be run at a profit.—Rocky Mountain News.
