"COMEDY AND TRAGEDY."

This is Mary Anderson's greatest play. When her audience witness the first part the laughter is so genuine that the tears come. When the tragedy reaches its height the horror is too great for tears. Her audience springs to its feet, longing to avert the seemingly inevitable climax.

Railroad King Depew and Standard Oil Whitney have already produced two acts of their political drama of like name, but may not be able to conclude the performance to their entire satisfaction.

At Minneapolis the curtain fell at the close of the first act, hiding from sight John C. New's well trained chorus of 150 Southern Postmasters, the echoes of whose lusty lungs yet proclaim "Coin is King."

The comedy was reopened in Chicago, where Ned Stokes' "Taumany Braves," crazed with fumes of Hoffman House fire water, danced round the Wigwam, while millionaire Whitney poured Standard oil upon the troubled waters of the pool political.

Meanwhile, John Morgan, the brainiest man in the U. S. Senate, adjusts his telescope down in Alabama, (which State, by the way, will go for Weaver) and, piercing the murky miasm which fouls the air of the political stage, reads the tragic finale of the drama written in fiery words, traced by an avenging heaven whose lightning will destroy the authors of the comedy beginning and conclude the drama in a manner surprising to their spirits in hades.

The tragedy he foretells will be suspended as long as patience endures wrong, but no longer.

Our hope is that it may never be enacted, that wrong shall cease.

Read Morgan's words in a recent issue of the North American Review with reference to the two old parties:

* * * * *

"Then comes forth, naturally and as a logical consequence, the arch fiend of bribery, and the whole country is alarmed and disgusted to find that the ballot is the mere merchandise of corruptionists and the wicked sport of gamblers. While the election is progressing, the amount of money spent is particular districts is considered the surest forecast of success, and the betting in political pool rooms is bulletined hourly as the safest index to expected majorities. If this government can be preserved in the revulsion that the people will some day create to wipe out these iniquitous consequences of national nominating conventions, our country may be again congratulated on having escaped a more embarrassing danger than that which followed the great Civil War. If this is to be done, the States alone can accomplish it."

Are we—American citizens—so senseless as to perceive not the pending climax in the tragedy which can only be averted by springing to our feet? Armed with ballots we may disarm those whose weapons are bullets, and thus prevent anarchy.
