**THE HOMESTEAD LESSON.**

The Homestead strike is over; the entrenched capitalist has prevailed against the unprotected laborer, and the workman, after starving for months, has listened to the piteous appeals of his wife and babies and gone back to work for less wages than before the strike.

Those who struck because they would not accept \$2.50 a day, now have the privilege of coming back (if not on the company's black list) and accepting \$1.85 for ten hours of toil in the soot of the smelting rooms and the heat of the blast furnaces.

Andrew Carnegie, the foreigner, whom the protective tariff policy of the Government enabled to pile up sixty millions of money, is enjoying himself like a feudal lord in Scotland.

The one and only solution of the labor difficulty is the restriction of foreign immigration.

The American workman is obliged to work for starvation wages because there is a hoard of hungry foreigners coming into the factories and workshops, eager to work at wages which, while small here, seem large to a man from across the water.

The labor problem will never be settled until the stream of paupers and criminals that flow into our domain through Castle Garden is turned back to its own source.

**WHAT DID IT.**

Both the New York Tribune and the San Francisco Chronicle have figured out that the cause of Republican defeat was the great inroads made in the Republican vote by the Peoples party. The papers ignored the third party movement but now are obliged to acknowledge that the Republican party went to the wall because of the two million votes cast by the Peoples party. We had hoped that the lesson of the third party in the campaign would not be lost on the Republican party and that the result of the campaign would be such as to awaken the party to the real needs of the people. The large vote of the Peoples party however and the terrible defeat of the Republican party leaves matters in such shape that the only way to ever overthrow Democracy is for the Republicans to let the old battered organization go to the dogs where it belongs, with its trusts, combines and tariff, tampered monopolies and join the Peoples party the party of true progress and reform. It is dead certain that the Peoples party are not going to them. The only way for the Democrats to capture the West is to give it free coinage.

**A NATIONAL SILVER LEAGUE.**

The silver producing states and territories should in the near future organize a national silver league on the same plan of the state leagues now in existence in Colorado, Idaho and Nevada. Organization is everything. If Montana had been properly organized she would have gone for free coinage as her sister states did, but as it is, she stands disgraced before the eyes of the nation. This must not be the case in the coming election. Let us begin at once and show the world that we will plead and supplicate no longer for simple justice, but we will stand ready to fight again in case it becomes necessary to get free coinage. Idle threats have no force, but when threats are made frankly, and carried out to the bitter end, as was the case in Nevada, Colorado and Idaho on November the 8th, they have weight. We ask for nothing but justice, and that we will have or somebody else will get hurt.—Silver State.
