State Board of Agriculture.

The annual meeting of the State Board of Agriculture was held at the Secretary's office at one o'clock yesterday afternoon...

The exact date of the commencement of the next annual fair was not fixed, but it was decided that it shall immediately follow the next annual California State Fair.

Hon. Theo. Winters was placed in nomination for President, but declined, whereupon W. O. H. Martin was unanimously elected.

C. H. Stoddard was re-elected Secretary and P. S. Osburn was elected Treasurer.

W. H. Gould was appointed Superintendent of Grounds; W. D. Phillips, Superintendent of Pavilion; Hon. Theo. Winters, Gen. C. C. Powning and Secretary Stoddard, Committee on Special Program; President Martin, W. H. Gould, and Secretary Stoddard, Committee on Premium List.

The Executive Committee consists of Hon. Theo. Winters, Gen. C. C. Powning, W. H. Gould, President Martin, Sen. M. D. Foley, Joseph Marzen, and H. M. Yerington.

A number of bills presented were allowed and the meeting adjourned.

A Great Stallion.
