

COUNTED OUT AGAIN.

Two years ago the Senate of Nevada decided that the people did not want a Constitutional Convention.

In order to arrive at this conclusion it was necessary to resort to unfair technicalities and the result was the disfranchising of nearly one thousand voters.

Take for instance Lyon county, it voted almost solid for a Constitutional Convention, but the clerk in reporting the returns wrote, "For a new Constitution" and this resulted in throwing out Lyon county.

This is the history of the great fraud of 93-91, yet last night the proposition to allow the people to once more say whether or not they wanted a new constitution was voted down by the Senate and Comins of White Pine led the fight which resulted in the people being deprived of the right to say whether or not they wanted a new Constitution.

To deprive them of the right of a voice in the matter is a flag law outrage which the people of the State will resent when they get a chance to express themselves.
