

NOT ANSWERED.

A GOOD SHOWING.

A summary of the important measures passed upon by the State Legislature is printed in the Journal. It shows that the Legislature was industrious and transacted more business in fifty days than had heretofore been accomplished in sessions of full sixty days duration, and in legislative expenses saved the taxpayers about \$20,000. With a Senate about equally divided politically and half the members determined to retard legislation by placing every possible obstacle in the way of the Silver party which controlled the House, the members elected last November reformed every pledge given by the Silver party to the people.

It was a clean body and for the first time in the history of Nevada Legislation, there is not even a suspicion that members were influenced by sordid motives in voting for or against any measure passed upon, and it elected a United States Senator, in accordance with the wishes of the people, without the expenditure of a dollar by the gentleman selected for the position.—Reno Journal.

The Coming Eclipse.

The total eclipse of the sun of April 16th, will be one of the longest of the century, with a maximum duration of totality of four minutes and forty-six seconds. The totality commences in the Southern Pacific, enters Chili in 29 degrees south latitude, passes north-westerly across South America and the Atlantic, enters Africa in 14 degrees north latitude, and leave the earth in the interior of northern Africa. Astronomers from many nations will observe the sight.

An opinion, delivered by Justice Blatchford for Chief Justice Fuller, in the case of Geo. A. Pettibone and other striking Clear Lake miners in Idaho against the United States court, decides in favor of the miners, and directed that the indictment against them be quashed.

These cases grew out of the riots at the Wardner mines. The court at that time had granted injunctions restraining the strikers from interfering with the men, and it was alleged that Pettibone and others conspired to break the laws of the United States. The court holds that the indictment under which they were convicted of this charge is defective in that it was not shown that the men had any knowledge of the order of the court.

An election machine built upon the principal of a cash register or "nickel in the slot" machine has been successfully tested in Warsaw, New York. It was a complete success. The polls were open at 6 a. m. and closed at 6 p. m. and polled 959 votes; the average time in booths of each voter was twenty seconds. In five minutes after the polls closed the vote was counted by the machine and recorded on the dial plate. The voter touches the key bearing the name of the candidate and the machine does the rest.
