Prunes for Nevada.

Some few years ago a prune boom struck California and everybody who put their land into French prunes did exceedingly well.

It was presently discovered that the prune was a very hardy tree and would grow in cold latitudes. The prune business spread to Northern California and thence to Oregon, where all who have invested are doing well.

Nevada is specially adapted to the growth of the French prune and many of the Carson Valley farmers are putting in a large acreage this year.

Dried prunes sell for 25 cents a pound, and an acre will yield a net profit of about \$500. This is the best kind of farming. The trees bear after four years. J. E. McDowell has shipped 20,000 trees from his San Jose nursery, to Nevada.
