

THE SILVER QUESTION IN THE CABINET.

It was reported a few days ago that there was a row at a cabinet meeting in Washington over the silver question and that a wordy war was waged between the President and Secretary Carlisle.

Carlisle's views were sustained by Gresham, Olney and Smith, but the other members of the cabinet thought it proper to pay out gold as long as there is any in the treasury and the President insisted that there is no need of keeping one hundred millions in gold in reserve.

Senator Vest, in speaking of the disagreement in the cabinet, said he was consulted by the President about calling congress together at an early day to repeal the Sherman act and the President was much surprised when informed that he could not accomplish anything as there is a majority of sixteen against the repeal of that act until a free coinage bill is passed.

It is impossible to ascertain whether Carlisle, as first reported, when provoked by the President, said he would resign, thought afterward dissuaded from doing so, but there is no doubt whatever of a disagreement between them on the policy of paying out gold exclusively for notes that are redeemable in silver or gold.
