THE NEVADA EXHIBIT. Something for our Citizens to be Proud of. The Chicago correspondent of the Chronicle has this to say of the Nevada exhibit: Chicago, May 23.—All the Pacific Coast States are making splendid showings in the Mines and Mining building.

Perhaps the most interesting feature of the entire exhibit is the original sand-stones which were recently discovered in the State and which contain footprints of some prehistoric birds, animals and human beings. They are about a dozen in number and are exhibited along one of the side walls.
