WHAT THE RECORDS SHOW.

NOT READY.

Sixteen Murderers Shot.

Piedras Negras, Mex., May 31.—A few days ago Don Luis Caravanges of the Bank of Durango started to visit a ranch owned by him 400 miles from Durango. It was in the possession of squatters, and Caravanges had often tried to make them pay rent. His trip was for the purpose of enforcing payment.

The squatters learned of this, and decided on the death of Don Luis, and drew lots as to who should commit the murder. Four men were selected, and they ambushed and assassinated Caravanges and his mozo. When word of the crime reached Durango, the Governor telegraphed to the ranger Captain Tapona, and he proceeded with a body of picked men to the scene of the tragedy. There he learned the particulars of the plot and the names of the conspirators. He next proceeded to catch these men. Sixteen of the twenty-two have been caught and summarily shot.

Big Jim Dead.

"Big Jim Cartter," who years ago was a sagebrush celebrity, died recently in San Francisco.

When in this country he was supposed to be able to lick his weight in wild cats every morning before breakfast.

"Big Jim Cartter" was the name by which the dead man was known in the mining districts of Nevada years ago. He was considered the handsomest and handiest "gun-fighter" in the Sagebrush State, and was probably the only human being who ever intimidated "Red-headed" Brown, the desperado who was finally killed by Vansickle near Genoa, while on his way from Carson to Aurora.

On account of the low price of silver, the Mt. Diablo Mine at Candelaria shut down yesterday. The company's mill at Soda Springs will hang up stamps some time this month. This will leave Candelaria without any of her mines working, and it is not likely that operations will be resumed in any of them until silver reaches a higher price than it is at present.
