**TAXING BIG INCOMES.**

Everybody agrees that certain men in the United States are acquiring wealth too fast. They are piling millions on top of other millions and at the rate money is being produced by the toil of the many and salted down by the few, it does not take much mathematics to figure out that the time must come when the few will have the bulk of the money.

The only way to check this vast accumulation of wealth is to adopt the plan of a graduated income tax. Just where to begin graduating the tax seems to be the main question.

The St. Louis Republic thinks that a tax on incomes of \$2000 a year would result in absolutely wiping out any party that put it in force, while a tax on incomes of \$5000 and over would certainly result in the defeat of the party responsible for it. But a tax on all abnormal incomes, say of \$10,000 a year or more, to be levied as long as it is necessary to pay pensions, would be sustained by the country as an emergency tax. Possibly the thing will be compromised and a post mortem tax will be substituted. That is, they will permit all of the voracious money-getters to gather all he can, but pounce upon his estate after he is dead. That would not be a bad idea, provided they could find the estates. There is no particular uniform scale that could be established to get a fair tax on incomes, because it is just as easy for some men to gather up \$20,000 in a year as it is for other men to gather together 20 cents. But the men who have the faculty of gathering the \$20,000 are very apt to have the faculty of concealing the fact. The post mortem tax would be fair; so much for each heir, and rest for the State. There is no ambition more honorable than for a man to try to obtain for himself and his family a competence. After that, for a man to wear out his life in search of money is utter foolishness, because the decree away back was that men should take no more out of this world than they brought into it.

**SHOT GUN MINING.**

While the public have so far only heard one side of the history of the troubles in the Buckeye mining district, it is apparent that there are too many Winchester and revolvers and too few picks and shovels on the Blackhorse claim.

Ever since the mines were located there have been misunderstandings and rows and the development of the mines have been seriously retarded. From all accounts there is gold enough in the District to keep a hundred men at work making good wages, but for some reason or another the parties in interest are unable to agree.

Whenever there is gold in sight there is contention, and men's greed gets the better of their judgement. The result is that gunpowder is brought in to supply somebodys lack of common horse sense and the development of the District is delayed and a black eye given to the whole proposition.


All over Nevada are mining camps that might be paying well to-day were it not for the greed and unfairness of men who want the lion's share of everything.


