FIGURES THAT TALK.

The Republican party of Ormsby county is already organizing for the next county campaign. They are continually asserting on the streets and through their organs, that the Silver party is gutting the treasury. The Auditor's reports show the following: Republican disbursements for 1892: First quarter.....\$13,318 68 Second quarter..... 15,425 30 Total.....\$28,743 98 Silver party disbursements for 1893: First quarter.....\$20,480 66 Second quarter..... 13,248 90 Total.....\$33,729 56 Balance in favor of the Silver party.....\$ 5,014 42 That is, the Silver Commissioners having no pets or pensioners to look after, have run the county expenditures nearly one thousand dollars a month cheaper than their predecessors, and in the first six months have saved over \$5,000 to the taxpayers. Any one can verify the figures by inspecting the county books in the Recorder's office.
