CORRECTED FIGURES.

It seems a pity that some one did not point out to the Tribune that the APPEAL's figures on county finance contained a typographical error. A 2 instead of a 1, made it read 20,000 instead of 10,000. The footings were correct, however, and the Tribune's war dance on what it supposed were the Silver party's expenditures, only makes it more ridiculous. The bald facts remain the same.

The first six months of the Republican party's rule in 1892 cost \$28,743 98, and the first six months of 1893 cost the taxpayers only \$23,729 56. A balance in favor of the new party of over \$5,000. The Auditor's books verify these figures. An argument based on a typographical error does not go far when there is nothing else to support it.

For the county to be out of funds is not new. It has frequently been short of funds in the last 20 years, with a Republican Board.

To show how easy it is to make mistakes in figures, the Tribune has but to turn to its Land Office report of yesterday, and find two glaring errors.

Hard Times.

An old miner from the Comstock, who has been stopping at Walley's Springs, speaking of the condition of affairs consequent upon the low price of silver and shutting down of the mines, states that sixty families of Virginia City have been compelled to apply to the county for aid, and that it is a common sight to see the children of destitute miners applying at hotels and restaurants for the scraps that usually find their way into the ash heap. The people of Denver are holding mass meetings to devise means of finding support for the destitute of that once prosperous city. The authorities of Kansas City went to the state line a few days ago with a force to prevent a train-load of several hundred destitute men from Colorado from entering the State. Not only are the starving miners deprived of the means of making an honest living in their own State, but they are not wanted in any other State. If this is the condition of affairs before, what will it be after the repeal of the Sherman act, in case the gold of Wall street blunts man's conscience to the appeals of right, justice and mercy!—Genoa Courier.

An Examiner Suggestion.

Among the numerous letters on the silver question published by the Examiner was one from a correspondent in Nevada asking whether it would be constitutional for the States to issue "trade commodities" of silver and use them as money. The Constitution does not allow the States either to coin money or to make anything but gold or silver coin a legal tender for the payment of debts, but there is a much simpler way of reaching the same end. Foreign silver coins used to be legal tender in this country, and it would be perfectly constitutional to make them so again. The Nevada legislature, if it choose, can give the legal-tender quality to Mexican dollars, and as Mexico allows free coinage the Nevada mine owners can send their silver to the Mexican mints, have it coined, bring it back home and use it as money to an unlimited extent. Colorado, Montana and any number of other States can do the same thing.—Examiner.

China and Japan are feeling the depression in silver as keenly as the other nations of the earth. The fall in the price has caused a loss of \$3,500,000 to the Japanese government on war ships alone.
