NEWLAND'S SPEECH.

Congressman Newlands of Nevada spoke in the house of representatives on the silver question. He presented the industrial side of the subject in a forcible and convincing manner.

It is difficult for a congressman or anybody else to say much that is new on the silver question. It has been discussed in the legislative halls, in the press and on the stump for years, yet it appears that the only straight-out silver representative elected did not present it in a new light.

"Never be Heard of."

Last fall the old party politicians claimed that Stewart would not be heard from in the East, if re-elected. Yet the current issues of Judge and Puck, both of which papers are deadly foes to silver, devote space to full page caricatures of the Silver Senator.

A dispatch says: There is a good deal of compromise talk at Washington. It is said the "steering committee" made a formal offer to the silver men for the passage of the repeal bill, accompanied by a law directing the purchase of three hundred million ounces of silver at a specified time, and all purchases to be closed thereafter, and the silver men have the matter under consideration.

In speaking of the speech of Congressman Maguire of San Francisco Cal., the dispatches say:

After Maguire had taken his seat he was heartily applauded by members on the floor and was also honored by applause in the galleries. He was in splendid voice. His arguments were considered original, and, taken all in all, the talk tonight is that the speech is one of the best the house has listened to this session.
