

SILVER PARTY STATE CONVENTION

Headquarters of the State Central Committee of the Silver Party, Reno, Nev., June 15, 1894.

At a meeting of the State Central Committee of the Silver Party of Nevada, held in Reno, May 23, 1894, it was ordered that a

STATE CONVENTION OF THE SILVER PARTY

Be held in—

CARSON CITY

TUESDAY, SEPT. 4, 1894, At 11 A. M.,

For the purpose of nominating a full State Ticket, to be voted for at the next general election, viz:

- Member of Congress,
- Governor,
- Lieutenant Governor,
- Judge of the Supreme Court,
- Clerk of the Supreme Court,
- Attorney General,
- Secretary of State,
- State Controller,
- Surveyor General,
- State Treasurer,
- Printer,
- Superintendent of Public Instruction,
- Two Members of Board of Regents of State University,

Also for the appointment of a State Central Committee and the transaction of such other business as may properly come before the Convention.

The basis of representation of the respective Counties in the said Convention shall be one delegate at large for each County, and one for each 40 votes and one for each fraction thereof cast for the Silver Party Electors at the last election, aggregating 201 delegates and apportioned as follows:

PRIMARY ELECTION

Of the people on

Wednesday, Aug. 15, 1894

For the purpose of electing delegates to the said Convention, the Primary Election to be carried out in compliance with the laws of the State.

The following list will be required of voters at said Primary Election: "I am in favor of the free coinage of silver at the ratio of 16 to 1 by the United States, independent of and other nation, and will support the nominees of the Silver Party."

The following resolution was unanimously adopted:

Resolved, That this Committee direct the County Central Committee of the Silver Party in the several Counties in the state to call Primary Elections at the time designated by this Committee and to district Counties, appoint delegates to the state Convention among the districts of their respective Counties, and supervise the election of such delegates. And that in counties having no regularly organized County Central Committee we recommend that members of the Silver Party immediately take steps to organize County Central Committees in their respective Counties, and that when from a county no such committee shall be organized that members of the State Committee in such counties be and are hereby authorized to call Primary Elections and supervise the election of such delegates.
