THE BARTINE--GREY MANIFESTO.

Ex Congressman Bartine and Secretary of State O. H. Grey have issued a manifesto to the people of Nevada calling attention, in a four column article, to the fact that the Republican party is now wheeling into line on the silver question, and demonstrating the assertion by "pointing with pride" to the resolutions on the silver question adopted by California and Michigan. Stiring resolutions in favor of silver as a money metal is no new thing with the Republican party, nor is it with the Democratic party. What the country most needs just now is a party to pass silver bills in Congress with a President to sign them.

Parties that adopt "strong silver resolutions" in State conventions and who supplement their actions by sending men to Congress who vote against silver bills, are not the sort of parties the American people are looking for at the present time.

The manifesto among other things says: "Our hope, and only hope that can be relied on in the near future, lies with the Republican party. On protective principles if none other, it is bound to help us."

On what basis these gentlemen make the above statement the Appeal is at a loss to understand.

Here is the record of the Republican party on the silver question.

Demonetized silver, 1873.

Defeated coinage bill, 1875.

Defeated free coinage in 1878, and substituted the silver purchasing act in the House, June 25, 1880, 23 Republicans voted for silver and 130 against.

April 8, 1888, Republicans for silver 30; against, 93. June 7, 1888, Republicans for silver, 15; against, 127. In the Senate, June 17, 1890, there were 15 Republicans voted for silver and 25 against.

In the House March 24, 1892, for silver, 11; against 67. Senate, July 2, 1892, for silver, 11; against, 111. (This was to vote to repeal the purchasing clause of the Sherman act at the extra session.)

The Bland seigniorage bill, which Cleveland vetoed, received only 15 Republican votes in the House, while 110 were cast against it. In the Senate 18 votes for and 20 against.

These are the cold facts in the case, and all the talk of what the party is going to do falls on weary ears when the starving miners of the West look over the back record of what the Republican party has not done for silver when it had the chance. The burden of the Republican song is this,

We have been over twenty years fighting silver. We have had scores of chances to remonetize it but did not. Now please give us another chance."

But the mining States of the West have been fed on promises long enough and their withdrawal from the party of false promises is complete and final. They cannot be wheedled back for they know that a return to the Republican party is only to be caught in the same old trap.

A JOURNALISTIC SUCKER.

Davis says the "Silver"-Populist party is stronger in Nevada than it was two years ago. It is always a safe proposition to copper what Davis says.—Tribune.

We gave the Tribune some political information two years ago which it "coppered" simply from an old habit it has of always "coppering" the Appeal. The next bill would secure his vote by the simple remark that "Johnson's fighting it."

So the poor dupe was handled all through the session on bills that Johnson had not ever heard of.


