COAST NEWS

August Raynor, superintendent of the construction of the Nevada Southern Railroad, committed suicide near Manvel, San Bernadino Co., Cal.

Benjamin Hamilton, 12 years old, while jumping on and off an electric street car at San Jose, finally jumped off in front of a team and his skull was crushed by the horses.

Edward Holtzheimer, a farmer, living five miles south of Tacoma, was shot and seriously wounded by an assassin Monday. Andrew Miller, an uncle of his wife, has been arrested and charged with the murder.

Suit has been begun at San Jose against the Southern Pacific Company for damages caused by the carelessness of its railroad employes while burning grass near Alme. Charles Ellis brings the suit, the fire causing a loss on his ranch estimated at \$5,200.

Judge Ross at Los Angeles has decided in a case where a registered Chinaman crossed into Mexico for a few days of pleasure and on his return was arrested and ordered deported, that the act of the Chinaman did not subject him to deportation under the law.
