THE STATE VICTORY.

The State returns show a clean sweep for the Silver party. The result is particularly gratifying to the party leaders, because the fight was made as a "straight goods" proposition, and all alliance with so called Populists was declined. Judge Currier of Washoe followed by the cranks, which are so numerous in that county, organized a movement which under the Populist's cloak was merely intended to be a menace to the Silver men to drive them into certain concessions which the Currierites demanded. A platform was adopted in which the Silver party was to join the grand Populist movement in '96, and this was all they demanded at the time. Then came the significant talk that it would be necessary to name Currier as Supreme Judge to keep his following in line for silver. Currier and his followers were told to go to the devil and so they started out to wreck the Silver party. The combine of the Republicans, Currierites and Dennis Democrats proved impotent to accomplish any result against the strong Silver sentiment of the State, and the people, headed by Francis Newlands ploughed under the Wall Street combine. It has been a grand victory for the people who have stood by the interests of the State regardless of the smooth eloquence of imported orators and sophistry of a hireling press.

You may fool the Nevada voter for a while but you can't fool him long, and last Tuesday the independent voters of Nevada showed that when they hoisted the banner of "free coinage before party" they meant what they said.

THE DISTRICT JUDGES.

The Silver party has elected the four District Judges. In the first Judicial District, comprising the counties of Lyon, Douglas, Esmeralda, Ormsby and Storey, Charles E. Mack has been elected over Judge Rising, who was supposed to be impregnable entrenched in that District. Judge Mack made an assault on the stronghold and carried it.

In the Second Judicial District, comprising the counties of Churchill, Humboldt and Washoe, Judge Cheney was re-elected by a large majority over both his competitors. There was a triangular contest in this District. Judge Dodge was the nominee of the Republican party and Judge Currier was the nominee of the People's party, and the returns indicate that Judge Cheney will have a majority over both.

In the Third District, comprising the counties of Esmeralda, Lander and Nye, Judge Fitzgerald was re-elected without opposition.

In the Fourth District, comprising the counties of Elko, Lincoln, and White Pine, Judge Talbot was re-elected, defeating Lieutenant Governor Pougade the Republican nominee.

CARRY THE NEWS.

As the clouds roll by the nakedness of the old goldbug parties in Nevada is revealed in all of its hideousness. The Republicans and Democrats are nailed to the cross, and will never be able to make another fight in the battle born state for the gold trust, or even a tax on wool and borax. Attorney Cook began his argument, which will be concluded tomorrow, and the case will go to the jury.


Later—The jury in the Worden case returned a verdict of murder in the first degree.

A Serious Loss.

The Gem Hotel of Elko was destroyed by fire at midnight on the 6th inst. The fire caught in the kitchen of the hotel and inside of fifteen minutes after the discovery the building was a mass of flames. For a time the whole block was threatened but by hard work the fire was confined to the hotel building. The furniture was nearly all destroyed, and the little that was saved from the fire was so damaged as to be really a loss. The property belonged to Mr. Ostreicher and the loss is estimated at \$30,000. The property was partially insured. The loss is a serious one to Elko as the hotel was one of the best and most completely furnished in Nevada.
