A MODEL PLATFORM.

If the National Committee of the People's party shall, at its St. Louis conference, to be held December 28 and 29, adopt the declarations of the Iowa, Populist State conference held on Monday last, upon the currency question, and have it understood that the Populists will fight the campaign upon that issue—holding in abeyance all others except such as the country is practically agreed upon—the People's party will carry a majority of the States at the next election. The declaration is so terse, so comprehensive, and yet so conservative that the News prints it conspicuously that it may not be forgotten. It is as follows:

Whereas, The contention of the People's party that the great need of this country has been and is an enlarged volume of money, is now practically conceded by all parties and by the Government and,

Whereas, The gold power and the banks are insisting, through the President and his Secretary, that the enlarged issue of our currency supply shall be given exclusively into the hands of the banks; that silver shall be excluded and that gold alone shall be a legal tender; now, therefore, be it,

Resolved, That, without attempting to make a platform for our party, this conference insists upon the restoration of the coinage of gold and silver as it existed prior to 1873, and that all paper currency shall be issued by the Government without the intervention of banks of issue, the same to be a full legal tender. We also declare our implacable hostility to the further issue of interest-bearing bonds. Upon these principles we declare our political faith and we invite the co-operation of all patriotic citizens against the further encroachment of corporate power.

What Western voter, what person in favor of an honest, sound currency and the restoration of the country's departed prosperity, cannot approve such a platform and support the party that adopts it? It is:

The free and unlimited coinage of gold and silver at the ratio of 16 to 1.

All paper money shall be issued by the general Government, without the intervention of banks of issue, the same to be full legal tender.

Implacable hostility to the further issuance of interest-bearing bonds.

Upon these principles the party declares its political faith and invites the co-operation of all patriotic citizens against the further encroachments of corporate power.

It will be observed that the volume to which the currency should be increased is left untouched. The platform confines itself to principles alone. When the principle have won; when free coinage, the Government issuance of all money, and no further interest-bearing bonds shall have prevailed, then details will be settled by Congress and the people and they will be settled rightly.—Denver News.

PENNOYER TO CLEVELAND

Governor Penoyer sent President Cleveland the following letter for a Christmas present:

Christmas has again visited our stricken land, with its prostrated industries and idle throngs willing but unable to work and unwillingly forced to beg or suffer. Your panacea—a change in the Sherman law and the tariff—has been administered, but there is no change in the sad condition of our unfortunate country. After two years of ruinous delay and mismanagement you have, thank Heaven, at last discovered the real trouble, although you have not proposed the proper remedy. As you now concede, the country needs more money, but it does not want the worthless stuff you proffer. It needs gold and silver money with which to pay debts, and it does not want bank rags with which it cannot pay debts.

Sixty years ago the Democratic party had a President who defied the banks in the interest of the people. Has it now a Preside

who defies the people in the interest of the banks?

All the traditions of the party which elected you are for gold and silver money and against bank currency. Do you aspire to furnish an example of treason to the cause intrusted to your care which will be without any parallel, except one, in all the annals of American history?

Your party in both Houses favors the restoration of silver as standard money, the people, actually suffering from the existing prostration of business, favor it, and will you not stand with them in overturning the monometallic policy of the British monied oligarchy which is fast degrading our fair country to the condition of a subjugated province and our hitherto free people to a condition of financial serfdom?

Always remembering the unemployed multitudes all over our broad and, I pray that God may give you light and strength to do the right.


