

THE NEW WARDEN.

The selection of L. O. Henderson as Warden of the Penitentiary will be generally approved by Silver men. His election by the Board was good politics. Elko sent a large petition asking for his appointment, and Elko was a county that had a right to ask of the Silver party almost anything within its gift. It was not accorded any place on the State ticket, but it gave a magnificent majority for the ticket from top to bottom.

Washoe county had a leading candidate for the place, but notwithstanding the experience of Mr. Bell and his backing, Washoe by its opposition to the ticket on election day forfeited all claims it might have had on the party. No county in the State gave the Silver party a more determined and troublesome opposition than Washoe.

The only regret is, that there were two candidates from Elko. Both were good men in all respects, but Henderson came in with heavier backing and the longest petition, and the Board could not consistently have done otherwise.

Mr. Henderson has served two terms as Sheriff and is a man with a reputation of fairness and first-class executive ability.

THE CASE OF GUNST.

The leading citizens of San Francisco who insisted on the removal of Moses Gunst, went off at half cock. After his appointment he should at least be given a chance to have demonstrated what he could have done in his office. He is a man whose word is his bond among men, and he never shirks his financial obligations. He would not have voted to have retained a blackmailing sergeant on the police force who built a fine house off the tolls he levied on prostitutes, as the other Police Commissioners did. Why did not the same mass meeting who called for Gunst's removal before he did anything, also call for the removal of the old fossils still on the Board who have made it a stench and disgrace.

THE STATE DEBT.

The Journal charges the Governor with an attempt to misrepresent the State's finances. We think that brother Kelly has overlooked the fact that the part of the State debt which the Governor did not allude to is the old Territorial indebtedness of \$380,000 which the State assumed when it entered the Union about thirty years ago. It is in the shape of bonds irredeemable and irreducible and never intended to be paid in whole or in part. The interest goes to the School fund.

Leaving this out of the account as has been the custom for years past, the real state debt is as the Governor puts it in his message.

The Society then adjourned to meet at Virginia City the first Monday in July.

Of 400 abandoned farms in Massachusetts 150 have been sold at an average price of one dollar and fifty cents an acre. In New Hampshire and Vermont most of the abandoned farms sold are bought for summer homes. It is remarkable that so many people continue to live in a climate the winters and summers of which are so extreme, when they can move to Nevada and get its delightful atmosphere and only two months of winter. If ground were a quarter of a dollar an acre in New England it would be dear.
