

CHICAGO CATTLE MARKET.

Beef cattle sell at six cents per pound, live weight in the Chicago Market, which is equal to twelve cents a pound dressed, the basis on which cattle are sold on this coast.

That there is a shortage of marketable cattle in the country is a well established fact. At all markets receipts show decreases from last year, the run at the four leading western points during January and February being 118,953 head less than during the corresponding time last year, as shown in our table of official receipts.

Prime cattle are worth a cent per pound more in Chicago than they were a year ago and prime sheep are from 60 to 75 cents per 100 pounds higher than a year ago.

EDITORIAL NOTES.

It is now said that Secretary of the Treasury Carlisle blundered again when he prophesied a surplus of revenues before the close of the present fiscal year. There is not the slightest doubt now that all of the millions procured by selling bonds will be consumed in paying the running expenses of the Government, and will not serve as a permanent brace for the gold reserve, which is sure to begin dropping in a short time.
