**REPUBLICANS AND SILVER.**

The action of the House on the Senate silver bill shows that there is a deep seated prejudice against the coinage of silver at the ratio of 16 to 1 in the Mints of the United States. To relieve the financial stringency the bill further provides for the immediate issue of silver certificates equal in the amount to the seignorage on the bullion purchased under the Sherman law.

Three amendments were offered in the House. One was to provide for the coinage of silver and place a prohibitory duty on the foreign silver, that was defeated by an overwhelming majority. Another was to coin silver free when Germany and France should agree to take similar action, and that was voted down. The third was to coin the American product and it met the fate of the others.

The defeat of those amendments in a Republican legislative body ought to silence the precinct statesmen of Nevada who have been asserting that the Republicans believed in the free coinage of silver and a tariff on foreign bullion.

It shows that, as Senator Jones expressed it, the Republican organization is opposed to the free coinage of silver. The party is sustained by a gold trust, is conducted in its interests and no self-respecting citizen of Nevada who desires to see the State prosper can give it his support.

Of course a few who are hankering for federal pap may be expected to follow the example of the Democratic leaders of four years ago, but the majority of those who have affiliated with it heretofore will go with their leader, Hon. H. F. Bartine, into the ranks of the free coinage party.

**A NEEDED LAW.**

The action of the Gold Hill Trustees in selecting A. E. Baugh of Nevada City, California, as their Principal certainly does not speak well for the educators in this State, and gives but little encouragement to them. There are certainly many professional educators in this State who are as well qualified to teach a Nevada school as is this California gentleman, but for some reason or other they are not wanted. The Gazette knows of at least two Nevada residents who are at present following the profession. They are young men of brains and perfectly familiar with Nevada ideas of learning and could have furnished the very best of credentials, but they evidently were not wanted.—Gazette.

The last legislature passed a law prohibiting the purchase of supplies outside the State and the law should be so amended as to protect home school teachers.

Mrs. Jane Shattuck, the slayer of Harry G. Pool, is a free woman. Mrs. Shattuck fainted when the verdict was announced. On a former trial she was found guilty of murder in the first degree and sentenced to imprisonment for life.

Judge Becher was not at all satisfied with the verdict. At the opening of Court he said:

"At half-past nine o'clock last night we concluded the case of the People against Jane Shattuck in this court. From the evidence it appears that the young man, Harry Poole, was deliberately enticed to his death. It left no doubt in the mind of the Judge that the defendant was conscious of what she did, and did know the difference between right and wrong at the time of the killing. The ending of the case was farcical. The interests of public justice are of too solemn and serious a nature to be passed upon lightly. I excused the jurors in that case until Monday. You will enter an order excusing them for the remainder of the term."

The candidacy of Senator Quay introduces new complications into the Presidential fight. As now figured out Reed will have New England solid, or 76 votes from that section. Morton will have the 72 delegates from New York; Quay can have the 64 votes from Pennsylvania, and Allison will have the 26 votes from Iowa. With Cullom having the 48 votes from Illinois, Davis the 18 votes from Minnesota, Madison the 16 votes from Nebraska, Bradley the 26 votes from Kentucky and Elkins the 12 votes from West Virginia, as is possible, and McKinley having the 46 votes from Ohio, it will make 404 votes accounted for, or nearly one half of the convention. The other Southern States, leaving out Kentucky and West Virginia will have 240 delegates, and in the middle west are Michigan, Wisconsin, Indiana and Missouri, with 116 votes. The Western States, including Kansas, have 106 votes.
