### To Fight on a Barge

El Paso, Feb. 19.—Maier's eyes are reported improving this morning and he will today go through his regular routine of training. He will be compelled to wear goggles for a day or two, but he will be in condition to enter the ring on Friday.

Galveston Tex., Feb. 19.—A rumor is current here this morning that Maier and Fitzsimmons will leave El Paso tonight to arrive at Galveston on Friday afternoon, take a steam tug with a barge attached, go three or four miles into the Gulf of Mexico and fight for the championship before a kineoscope and a few witnesses. It is said that the kineoscope people are willing to pay the purse and all expenses, and S. A. C. will do anything that will let him out on the deal.

### Mrs. Cooper vs. Brown.

San Francisco, Feb. 19.—The committee of the Congregational Council which is trying Dr. Brown for alleged immorality and unministerial conduct met this morning to receive the charges of immoral conduct made by any person. The only person who appeared to prefer charges were Sarah B. Cooper and her daughter, Hattie Cooper. Dr. Brown had appointed her one of his pastoral assistants. The charges were not divulged by the committee, but will be presented to the Council this evening.

### Drew's Body Recovered.

Truckee, Cal., Feb. 19.—The body of Lester Drew was recovered about noon Sunday from Donner Lake. It was on the bottom 115 feet. His mother and Mr. Whitaker come down Sunday night from Virginia City, and today they held the funeral services in the Church. This evening the remains will be taken by way of Reno to Quincy, Plumas County to be interred.

### Morgan's Bonds.

Washington, Feb. 19.—The following announcement was made by the Treasury Department today: "J. P. Morgan & Company and associates, under their bid of \$1000,000,000 of United States 4 per cent. bonds redeemable in 1925, made in accordance with the recent circulars of the Secretary of the Treasury, are entitled to receive bonds of the face value of about four million seven hundred thousand dollars, in addition to those of which they already have been notified.
