Hanged in Effigy.
Lapeer, Mich., Feb. 28.—Four effigies were found dangling from as many telegraph poles when the good people of Lapeer got up yesterday morning. The quartette were labelled "Don M. Dickinson," "Elliot Stevenson," "Piel Buckridge" and "Irving McArthur."

This little lynching bee was the outgrowth of the furious indignation of Lapeer patriots because in their opinion the wrong man got the Postoffice. There had been several candidates, most of whom had greater popular support than did the successful man, Irving McArthur, who gave up the office of deputy Sheriff to handle the mails. McArthur has lived here only five years and the old inhabitants thought he was not in line for the Post-office plum. Dickinson worked hard for the appointment and McArthur got the place.

Stood by While a Man Killed his Wife.
Ashland, Ky., Feb. 28.—A confession was made last night at Catlettsburg by James Dewitt, who was brought here some weeks ago to escape a Carter county mob that was advancing to the Grayson jail to hang him for the alleged murder of his wife. Dewitt shifts the burden of the crime upon one Rose, who he says struck the woman over the head with a club, afterward choking her to death. Dewitt admits standing by and seeing the murder accomplished, and afterward aiding in the concealment of the body. The motive of the crime was to get the woman out of the way, as Dewitt had been unable to obtain a divorce in the Circuit Court but a short time before.

The Butler Miller.
San Francisco, Feb. 28.—The police still believe that Frank Miller, the butler for Franklin, enticed the man into the house and killed him to establish a record for bravery in defending his employers house. At the Coroners inquest today over the body of the dead burglar, several policemen testified that the door had been opened from the inside, and that there were no evidences of a forcible entry. The jury rendered a verdict that Miller had killed the unknown man while defending Franklin's property. The police say that Miller will be arrested for murder.

A Big Strike.
Baltimore, Feb. 28.—One of the largest labor strikes ever inaugurated in this city is now on in earnest. Five thousand members of the United Government-workers' organization remained away from work today. This general strike was caused by the manufacturers refusing to recognize the organization.

A Suicide.
New York, Feb. 28.—W. Buckner, a jeweler of Jersey City, thought to himself suicide today by shooting himself through the heart. Buckner has been in poor health for some time and has been unable to do any work. This made him despondent. He leaves a widow and children.
