THE SENATORIAL FIGHT.

The indications are that the Senatorial fight is warming up and that the adherents of Nixon are gaining strength in the eastern part of the State.

Defections from Jones strength are reported in Washoe and one in this county. Storey is solid for Jones and the Storey delegation will make his fight when the legislature meets.

Nixon claims all the eastern delegation who were not pledged to Jones and some who were. Some of the members who were pledged to Jones claims that they had no other alternative, there being no other candidate. The Jones adherents say that these men cannot honorably violate their pledges. It has been suggested that when members elect are in doubt what course to pursue they should be governed by the will of the voters as expressed in petitions.

The friends of Jones say that these people have forced Nixon into the fight to bleed the Senator and that he will not spend a dollar in any way, shape or manner to further his interests.

Nixon is not so fixed that he can spend any money and the novel spectacle will be presented of a Nevada Senatorial fight on deck in which no money will be used.

There are rumors of Republicans coming in to get the complimentary vote in order to get solid with the National administration. There is likely to be as hot a contest over this vote as over the silver vote.

The Senatorial election comes off the first Monday after the meeting of the Legislature, and the Legislature meets on the 18th.

ROSS JACKSON.

The newspaper profession of San Francisco loses one of its best beloved members in the death of Ross Jackson. The Wave says of him:

Few newspapermen enjoyed either in or out of journalism the popularity which Ross Jackson had achieved. Not only his own kind cared for him, but likewise the men and women of all the other worlds with whom he came into contact. It was because of an instinctive impression that he wished to be fair and would be true, that he inspired this feeling. He possessed in a rare degree the timely virtue of sincerity; he made few professions, entertained few delusions and never went back on a friend.

More than this could not be said of anyone and what is best of all about it, he deserved it. He requested before he died that at his funeral the rooms of the Press club be decorated with flowers and ferns, but no signs of mourning, and the club carried out his last wishes. He was a broad minded, noble minded, good fellow every inch of him and his presence in the Club always inspired good cheer and good fellowship.

Harvard has now 3636 students, exclusive of the students in the Summer School and in Danville college, which would add 1000 more. But the increase this year was only seventy-seven, the smallest since 1888. The university authorities attribute it to the financial depression. Perhaps it would have been greater if the managers of that institution had attended exclusively to educational matters, and had not gone outside among their preaching and their writing, added to the depression upon the college.
