SOUTHERN TOWNS

Distances from One Camp to Another and How to reach Them.

Most people have an indirect knowledge of the location of the various newly established towns in the Southern Nevada gold districts few of them have any definite intelligent idea as to where each town actually is and the relative direction and distance of one from another. It will therefore be of interest to many and valuable to some to have them set forth. The following carefully prepared information regarding these localities, the names of which are seen and heard of every day more and more as time passes, but just where they are situated in the broad expanse of southern country few persons could tell, even among some of those interested more or less in mining affairs.

Goldfield is 28 miles south of Tonopah; 15 miles south of Goldfield; Tank Springs; 29 miles south bring one to Summerville, the new strike which is 3 miles west of Throp's Mill where is located the Nevada-Goldfield Mining Company's property. 27 miles south from Summerville is Mud Spring, 8 miles south from Mud is Old Bullfrog or Amagoza (now deserted) where the Original Bullfrog district, now about six months of Three-quarters of a mile south is the new town of Bullfrog, formerly called Bonanza. From Rhyolite to Beat a town of 500 people, is 4 miles not east, passing the rich Montgome Edwards mine. Go in farther south from Beaty, 4 miles, one reach Gold Centre with its 250 people. A hundred and ten miles southeast from Bullfrog are located the rich strike of Los Vegas, reached by some of the Clark railroad and stage.
