Breyfogle and Scotty Confused.

Some Pennsylvania people and two alleged Goldfield miners, with strange ideas of Nevada geography, have linked the mine of the noted Scotty with that of old man Breyfogle, of Breyfogle mine fame.

The following dispatch from Allentown, Penn., is supposed to be explanatory:

William H. Webber and W. H. Wells, of Goldfield, Nevada, are here endeavoring to obtain from the heirs of the late Benjamin Breyfogle the title to the property in Death Valley, on which is located the secret treasure mine of Walter Scott.

Breyfogle left here in 1863 and went to Nevada where he purchased a huge tract in Nye and Esmeralda counties. He died before he could reveal the location of a mine, which has since been rediscovered by Scotty.

Wells and Webber are trying to get the heirs together and make an agreement of purchase.
