### OUR NEXT U. S. SENATOR

Attorney-General Jas. G. Sweeney, as chairman of the Democratic State Central Committee, has issued a call for the committee to meet in Carson on the 21st inst. At this meeting the plans for the approaching campaign will be fully discussed, and it is understood that an aggressive program will be formulated. A large number of ambitious politicians who have recently risen to sudden wealth through successful mining operations have their eyes on the United States Senatorship, and it is probable that considerable money will be expended this fall in securing friendly "hold-overs" in the State Senate. It looks as if the good old times, when the Sharons, the Fairs and some others thought nothing of spending a half million for the honor of representing the Sagebrush State in the "Greatest Club in the World." The legislative appropriation bill which has just passed Congress, contains a provision for the retirement of all clerks at the age of 70 years, but the act will not take effect until 1913 seven years hence.
