BIDS WANTED FOR CONCRETE WALK AROUND CARSON CITY SCHOOL HOUSE

Front walk to be 180 feet long by
8 feet wide.

West walk to be 180 feet long by
5 feet wide.

South walk to be 167 feet long by
5 feet wide.

North walk to be 167 feet long by
5 feet wide.

There will be 2 concrete walks from
front walk to both front entrances 10
feet 6 inches wide with 3 concrete
steps.

One concrete walk from north walk
to boiler room 7 feet wide

One concrete walk from North en-
trance 9 feet wide.

One concrete walk to basement on
south side 4 feet wide.

One concrete walk to basement on
south side 7 feet wide.

Coping to be 12 inches high and to
extend all around the main walk on
the inside of walk—north, south and
east sides.

All uneven places to be filled with
sand and gravel and brought to height
of grade stakes, and be well wet and
tamped down.

The first layer of concrete must be
4 inch thick, composed of 4 barrels
gravel, 2 barrels sand, to 1 barrel of
Golden Gate cement, well mixed and
tamped until water comes to the sur-
face.

Top coating to be one part of ce-
ment to two parts sand and to be
tinted with lamp black, and to be one
inch thick and marked off in blocks
4 feet square.

All work to be smooth finished and
in workmanlike manner.

Contractors to remove all dirt and
rubbish.

All bids must be admitted on or
before the 10th day of April, 1906.

The board reserves the right to re-
ject any and all bids.
