There is a wide gulf between the civil service commission and Perry Heath, First Assistant Postmaster-General. Perry issued a notice the other day to all Federal office holders that there was nothing in the Civil Service law to prevent their jumping in and whooping up things for republican candidates, and that administration expected them to do it, or words to that effect. The Civil Service Commission has issued a circular to the members of the seven hundred boards of examiners throughout the country, warning them against "pernicious political activity," under penalty of removal from the Boards. Inasmuch as the members of these Examining Boards are, in almost every instance, Federal office holders and that their removal from the boards would not affect their offices, the penalty is not a severe one by any means.
