The Council met in adjourned session last Wednesday night and appropriated five hundred dollars towards the good roads demonstration. This amount, while not as much as was really needed, will nevertheless be of great assistance. Had the finances of the town justified it, they would have given the thousand dollars asked. The spirit manifested by the Council in making this appropriation is deserving of commendation, for it shows a lively appreciation of their obligation to act when in their judgement it is for the good of the community.

Charged With Attempted Assault

The sheriff's office was notified Thursday morning that a negro had attempted an assault on a white woman near the refinery just a short time previous. The officers at once made efforts to capture the criminal. Chief of Police Chargois and Deputy Felix Latiolais found a suspect named Will Johnson near Beausejour park. When they attempted to arrest him he started to run into the house and Deputy Latiolais shot, the ball striking the negro in the hip bone. He was brought to town and placed in jail and given medical attention.

As there was considerable doubt as to the captured negro's guilt another clew was followed up and a negro boy by the name of Stirling Harnisch, about fourteen or fifteen years of age, was arrested by Deputy Peck and officers Veazey and Hebert. The young negro confessed that he was the one who had frightened the white lady, but stated that that he didn't mean any harm. He was walking down the road with a sack in his hand and seeing the lady whom he knew he just thought it would be fun to throw the sack over his head and run up to her and scare her and he did, but she frightened him by her cries and he made off as fast as he could go. It being evident that the little negro is the real culprit Johnson was released and he was well enough to walk out of jail.


